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DAY ONE: Travel to Branson, MO. Check into your hotel and prepare for a night with ELVIS! See a brand new show from Joseph Hall, aka Elvis at the Owen's Theatre. This young man from Nebraska, Joseph Hall, was #2 on NBC's "America's Got Talent 2008", performed in "Legends in Concert" in Las Vegas, NV, headlined the First Annual "Elvis Cruise" and recognized as one of the Top 3 Elvis Tribute Artists.

DAY TWO: Visit the Mount Pleasant Winery. In addition to touring the facility and tasting award-winning wines, you can also take the opportunity to bottle your own dessert wine. Then you can explore Branson Landing, browse, shop or dine. This afternoon return to Owen's Theater for another Joseph Hall Show and Bill Chrastill. Bill combines a variety of music in his show, from the fifties, sixties and classic rock. His love for country music has him playing songs from yesterday and today. DAY THREE: Before departing Branson, take a tour of the unique campus at the College of the Ozarks, where students graduate debt free! See the William Memorial Chapel, Greenhouses, Mill and Fruitcake and Jelly Kitchen. The Chapel was dedicated in May 1958, constructed with student labor and native limestone. The Greenhouses have the McDade Orchid Collection, that is cared for by the students. Since 1934 the College of the Ozarks has been producing its world famous fruitcakes. Today student workers bake more than 40,000 cakes as well as making jellies and apple butter. The Mill is powered by a twelve foot water wheel, students grind whole-grain meal and flour and also weave rugs and baskets. Sit back, relax and enjoy the rest of the journey home.
